GET IN EARLY. Queuing time will be shortest between 11.15 when the gates open and 12.15. We have enhanced security procedures in place which means it will take you longer to get into Principality Stadium than it has done in the past.



CHECK BEFORE YOU TRAVEL. Be aware of road closures and public transport timetable alterations.



MAKE SURE YOU KNOW WHERE YOUR GATE IS and allow time to get there. Not all gates face the city centre.

ALL BAGS ARE SEARCHED. Your waiting time will be longer if you bring a bag. We will not permit large bags into the stadium, but small bags and handbags will be allowed. We class small bags as no larger than 35cm x 40cm x 19cm.

Here is everything you need to know to get the most out of your Natwest 6 Nations experience today:

- Queuing time will be shortest between 11:15 and 12:15.
- All bags are searched. There are separate lines for bag searches which are signposted, but please be aware you will need to allow more time if you bring a bag
- Make sure you know where your gate is and allow time to get there. Not all gates face the city centre



ROAD CLOSURES

With the kick off at 14.15, there will be a full road closure around the stadium from 10.45 until 17.15.

Enhanced security measures will be in place at Principality Stadium so all those that are coming to Cardiff to watch the game are strongly advised to leave plenty of time to get into the city and into the stadium.

Those travelling by car are strongly advised to book a space in the park & ride facility through the following link- https://www.parkjockey.com/principality-stadium

The gates to the stadium will be open three hours before kick-off at 11.15 with the game starting at 14.15.

Cardiff Council will re-open the roads when it is safe to do so after the event. Usually this is approximately an hour after the match has finished.

From early in the day, Scott Road and Park Street will be closed as a result of the need to prepare Gate 5 and protect queuing fans.

The following roads will be closed at 10.45:

- Kingsway from its junction with North Road to its junction with Duke Street.
- Cowbridge Road East from its junction with Cathedral Road to its junction with Westgate Street.
- Tudor Street from its junction with Clare Road to its junction with Wood Street (access for residents and traders will be permitted via Fitzhammon Embankment.)
- Plantagenet Street and Beauchamp Street from their junctions with Despenser Place to their junctions with Tudor Street (access for residents and traders will be permitted.)
- Saunders Road from its junction with St Mary Street.
- Customhouse Street throughout its length (access to private car parks will be permitted).
- Penarth Road from its junction with Saunders Road to the entrance leading to the rear
 of the Central Train Station.
- The following roads will be closed in their entirety: Duke Street, Castle St, High Street, St Mary Street, Caroline Street, Wood Street, Central Square, Westgate Street, Quay Street, Guildhall Place, Golate, Park Street, Havelock Street and Scott Road.

Additions:

Civic Centre: Access to part of the Civic Centre will be controlled throughout the day, with access allowed only for event parking, limited commuter parking, loading and access to private car parks.

Roads affected include: King Edward VII Avenue, Museum Avenue, City Hall Road, College Road and Gorsedd Gardens Road.

From 3.45pm, Station Terrace will be closed. Cars will be able to exit the Capitol Shopping Centre car park via North Edward Street/ Station terrace — northbound onto Newport Road/Dumphries place.

Please note:

If there are any safety concerns in connection with crowds queuing to go into the venue prior to gates opening, there may be a need to close Wood Street and Westgate Street earlier, along with lane restrictions adjacent to Gate 1 on Cowbridge Road East.

If there are any safety concerns relating to the queuing system at Cardiff Central Train Station, then Wood Street, Westgate Street, Park Street, Havelock Street, St Mary Street, Penarth Road, Saunders Road and Customhouse Street will remain closed until safety concerns are remedied.

PARK & RIDE

Park & Ride Cardiff West, Leckwith – Post code: CF11 8EG

Getting there: Access from Junction 33 of the M4, then follow signage to site on Leckwith Road

Distance from City centre / Principality Stadium: 1.5miles (10-15mins)

Drop-off Point: Tresillian Way North, at rear of Railway Station

Distance from city centre: 4.5 miles (18 to 20 mins)

Cost: £10 payable on the day at the car park (cash only) or £8 pre-book — If you pre-book you will be required to PRINT AND HAND TO THE SELLER YOUR PRE-BOOKING CONFIRMATION, without this printed confirmation you will be required to pay cash on the day.

Staff will arrive at the car park at 8.30am and will open at 9.00am with the first bus leaving at 9.00am. The last bus will leave the pick up at the pick-up point at 6.30pm with the car park closing at 7.00pm.

EVENT-DAY PARKING

Sophia Gardens (Cars) car park (Approximately, 0.5 mile walk to the Principality Stadium, Gate 2).

Getting there: Exit junction 32 of M4

Cost: £15 payable on the day at the car park (cash only)

Parking time: Car park opens at 8am and closes at midnight

Please note: Sophia Gardens car park will be staffed until 5.30pm, all vehicles are left on site at the owner's risk. Cardiff Council will not be held responsible for any theft or damage to motor vehicles or personal possessions. Any vehicles left in the car park after closing time will be fined.

Civic Centre Event Day Parking (cars)

Getting there: Exit Junction 32 of the M4, head south on the A470 towards the city centre and follow signage to the civic centre.

Cost: £12 pre-book online or £15 payable on the day at the car park (cash only).

If you pre-book parking you will be required to print the pre-booking confirmation and hand it to staff when parking your vehicle.

Parking time: The car park opens at 8am and either have to be removed or a pay and display ticket has to be put on the vehicle from 8am on Sunday February 4th.

RAIL

Great Western Railway

Great Western Railway will be providing the following additional Services on February 3rd

- Two additional trains from and to Bristol Temple Meads
- One additional from and to London Paddington
- One additional from Swansea, and three to Swansea
- One additional from Port Talbot Parkway.

Arriva Trains Wales

Arriva Trains Wales is advising customers' that trains in the Cardiff area will be busy all day. Extra capacity will be added, however, if travelling into the City by train to attend the match, customers should take the earliest service possible.

After the match, customers for local Cardiff and Valley Line services will use Cardiff Queen St Station - so trains for Penarth; Barry; Aberdare; Treherbert; Merthyr; Rhymney; Coryton and stations on the City Line. The usual queueing system will be in place at Cardiff Central for all other destinations.

MOTORWAYS & TRUNK ROADS

As with all major events, ticket holders are encouraged to plan their travel well ahead and make allowances for busy motorways and trunk roads. The M4 corridor and approaches to Cardiff are expected to be very busy.

TAXIS

St Mary Street Taxi Rank (Outside House of Fraser) will close at 10.45am and will re-open from 5.15pm.

BUS

Local Buses

Buses will be diverted out of the central city bus stops. Buses displaced from stops within the closure will relocate to either Churchill Way for the east, Greyfriars Road for the north or Tudor Street for the west.

Please visit the relevant bus operator's website for more information about your specific bus route.

National Express

National Express coaches will use Sophia Gardens as usual.

CAN YOU CYCLE OR WALK?

Those who live locally in Cardiff may want to travel by bicycle or walk. Research shows us that 52% of car trips made in the Welsh capital are less than 5km. This is a distance that can be comfortably cycled in 20 minutes.

We also know that 28% of Cardiff residents who currently do not cycle would like to do so.



Gates (See left)

General Rules

Entry to the stadium will be denied to any person carrying alcohol, any drink containers, recording equipment, photographic equipment, airhorn, golf umbrellas or any article (for example, a firework or flag stick) which may be used as a weapon or missile.

Please be aware that smoking is not permitted in any area of the stadium

No duplicate ticket will be issued in the event of the original ticket being misplaced or lost.

SECURITY





SECURITY

The safety and security of all our visitors is our Top Priority.

With the recent tragic events in the UK, we are continually reviewing our security procedures at the stadium. We work very closely with South Wales Police, the Wales Extremism & Counter Terrorism Unit and our local partners to ensure that there is a coordinated and appropriate level of security in place for each and every event.

If you're coming to the stadium, please ensure you arrive in plenty of time to pass through our enhanced security checks.

Our security and stewarding teams are there for your safety. Please cooperate fully with all security personnel.



OUR BAG POLICY

Due to the current unprecedented security situation, it's better for everyone if you do not bring a bag at all. We will not permit large bags into the stadium but you will be permitted to take small bags and handbags in with you. We class small bags as no larger than 35cm x 40cm x 19cm or standard handbags. There are no bag storage facilities available at the stadium — please plan ahead if you intend travelling to Cardiff with a large bag.









PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Professional Cameras, Audio / Video Recorders
 Lasers or Flash Lights / Selfie Sticks / Golf Umbrellas
 / Pyrotechnics
- Knives, Tasers, Mace, or Glass Items
- Any Item/Action deemed to challenge public safety

PREPARING FOR OUR SEARCH PROCEDURES

It's really simple.

- Finish up any food and drink before you enter the stadium as you're not allowed to take these in with you.
- Head to the gate that is stated on your ticket and join one of the gueues.
- The bag search lanes are clearly indicated.
- Please present yourself to one of our Search Stewards with your coat open and be prepared for a body search and to answer any questions that you may be asked.
- Once through the search procedure, present your ticket at the turnstiles and enter the stadium.





WHAT ELSE DO WE DO TO KEEP YOU SAFE?

There are many visible security measures that you may see while in and around the stadium and some that you will not:

- Each and every event is threat assessed by South Wales Police and appropriate police resources put in place in and around the stadium and the city centre.
- We also use 'sniffer dogs' in certain areas to aid in our vehicle and personnel searches.
- Together with our well-trained stewarding staff, we have a comprehensive and continually monitored CCTV system in operation at all times.
- Prior, during and post each event there will be road closure plan put into place by Cardiff City Council around the stadium, with anti-vehicle countermeasures being used.





REMEMBER TO COME PREPARED FOR ALL WEATHERS AND WEAR SUITABLE CLOTHING

- Small Umbrellas are permitted but cannot be used whilst the event is in progress. Strictly no golfing umbrellas are allowed inside the venue.
- Don't forget your medication if you need to take it during the day
- Remember to drink plenty of water to stay hydrated
- For everyone's safety Principality Stadium is a Zero Tolerance venue to drugs and Legal Highs
- Look after each other agree a meeting point if you get separated from your friends
- If you have any concerns during the day speak to our stewarding team
- Our on-site medical staff are there to help you if you feel unwell.
- **Challenge 25 will be in operation** Please remember ID if you are lucky enough to look younger than you are!

IF YOU LEAVE THE BUILDING THEN YOU WILL BE REFUSED ACCESS BACK INSIDE.





WILL THE ROOF BE OPEN OR CLOSED?

The decision regarding the stadium roof will be made on Friday 2nd February. Please ensure that you wear appropriate clothing for all weather conditions.

CAN I BRING AN UMBRELLA?

Small umbrellas will be permitted, however no large/golf umbrellas will be permitted beyond the search lines.

WHAT FOOD AND DRINK WILL BE AVAILABLE?

We will have a number of hot and cold food outlets available, with a variety of offerings, available around the stadium concourse. There will be a number of dedicated kiosks and bars selling soft and alcoholic drinks both on the concourse and within the stadium bowl.

CAN I BRING MY OWN FOOD AND DRINK?

Sorry, but this is not permitted. There are plenty of food and drinks outlets within Principality Stadium to suit a variety of tastes.

CAN I BRING MY OWN WATER/SOFT DRINKS?

No. We will empty any plastic container and remove the top, which you can refill with water from food outlets within Principality Stadium.

MY TICKET HASN'T ARRIVED YET. WHAT SHOULD I DO?

If your tickets haven't arrived, please contact the agent you booked via.

CAN I TAKE PICTURES AT THE EVENT?

Yes, we encourage you to share your experiences on social media. Please note, no professional cameras/ video-cameras will be permitted.

CAN I BRING PERFUME/AFTERSHAVE?

No. We don't allow any liquids or glass bottles into the venue so we advise not bringing perfume or aftershave, otherwise you will have to dispose of this before entry.

ARE THERE ANY AGE RESTRICTIONS?

Under 16 years must be accompanied by an adult.

WHERE CAN I BUY MERCHANDISE?

There will be a number of merchandise outlets available both outside and inside the stadium.

IS THERE AN ATM ONSITE?

There are no ATMs available onsite. You can use cash and card at all bars and kiosks.

IS THERE A CLOAKROOM ONSITE?

No, there is no cloakroom facility available for this event.

THE STADIUM OPERATES ON A NO READMISSION POLICY.
